Virgilio, Brunswick aggressive in shutout of Titans

BRUNSWICK - When she's on a wrestling mat, Brunswick sophomore Kate Virgilio's coaches tell her to constantly stay aggressive.

That advice helped her win a girls state title at 115 pounds as a freshman. And it echoed in her mind in an entirely different context on Monday.

Lined up as the rusher on fourth down, Virgilio didn't hesitate to speed into Tuscarora flag football's backfield, looking to make one final stop. She stayed on the attack and pulled the flag, picking up the sack that sealed the Railroaders' 6-0 home win over the Titans, their first victory of the season.

"I stayed hungry. I was there," Virgilio said.

That was the case on Tuscarora's final possession.

Virgilio also recorded a first-down sack and helped the Titans lose yardage on another play.

"Run as hard as you can," Virgilio said. "If you get hit, you get hit."

That fearless mindset combined with elite conditioning – she also runs cross-country – has made Virgilio an every-down player for Brunswick (1-1) a year
