BRUNSWICK — For every potential big play Brunswick had a chance to turn on Friday, it seemed Montgomery County Little League-Lower always had an answer on defense. Much of that answer was first baseman Charlie Frank.

Of the 10 putouts he was involved with, Frank had six on unassisted plays, with the ball being hit right at him. Nothing seemed like it was going to get by him.

While Frank's defense was superb, Brunswick struggled in that facet of the game. MCLL-Lower took advantage of five Brunswick errors to score four unearned runs.

MCLL-Lower also got a combined one-hitter from two pitchers. All of this was too much for Brunswick as it was eliminated by MCLL-Lower, 4-0, in the elimination bracket final of the District 2 Little League 10-12 Tournament at Marvin E. Younkins Memorial Field.

"Man, that first baseman had about a million putouts," Brunswick manager Cory Rhodes said. "It was just one of
